The Princess opened the door and looked inside. It was a small room with just one stool by the window and a strange object. A crooked old woman sat on the stool, working on that object.


"Good day, dear lady," said the Princess politely.

The old woman stood up and magically transformed into the thirteenth fairy! She flew away and left the Princess lying asleep on the ground.




The mice and their King returned to the village. They cleaned up the mess and built their own houses.


As time went by, the mice families grew bigger, and soon, more than a hundred mice were living happily together in their tiny village among the ruins. They got their food from the crops and trees that

"Why would I do that? The route we use suits us well," said the Elephant King.


"Our homes lie on that route,"






Thumbelina was happy with the mouse and took good care of her house. Soon winter was over and the mouse told her, "It's summer time at last! My neighbour will visit us soon!"





The mouse would sneak into the forest during the day. He would hide among the trees and bushes while looking for food but he would always return home before sunset.





"Phew!" said the mouse. "You scared me. Thank you for saving my life, though. That vulture would have made a meal out of me, had you not arrived on time."



One morning, the wolf set out to find food. He searched here and there and everywhere. Alas! He could not find food! Where had all the food gone?


